### SOME FINDINGS

Incal authorities need support and training on ways to inform citizens about their rights political participation

Citizens reveal explicit difficulty to identify themselves as political active members in their communities













Lack of responsiveness from local authorities detaches peoples from participation

## SOME FINDINGS

Work needs to be done in terms of making the mechanisms more citizens friendly

Much of the forms of political participation recognised by them are processes that are initiated and led by decision makers and where they cannot fully make use of their voice and experience to add something to the process itself.
