The European Universities

This initiative, launched in 2018 by the European Commission, promotes closer cooperation between higher education institutions in Europe, thus boosting their internationalization and global competitiveness. The European Universities are Alliances made up of groups of universities working for:

- The construction of joint **governance** structures.
- The definition of common **objectives** and shared **strategies**.
- The design and development of **innovative curricula**, including joint programmes, microcredentials and work-based learning experiences.
- The internationalization of learning paths and research careers of both **students** and **staff**.

In 2019, the European University of the Seas (SEA-EU), a consortium of six universities spread across the European coastline, was awarded with a Project under this initiative, due to last until 2022.

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SEA-EU 1.0: some achievements



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- Initial design of joint degrees: Bachelor, Master and Doctorate
- Approval of a **EMDM** (Erasmus mundus Design Measures) 97/100
- A protocol for proposing **new degrees** with the SEA-EU label
- Other joint initiatives of training: BIP, microcredentials...
- SEA-EU labs for online training
- Internships and co-mentoring abroad
- Increased mobility (staff weeks, intensive courses, blended and virtual mobilities)
- Research potential database, including research groups (360) and infrastructures (60).
- Multilingualism (Virtual language courses, Virtual Tandem language Exchange)
- Service learning
- Volunteering programmes...

In **2022**, a new call was launch to provide further support to those Alliances who demonstrated tangible results and willingness go on deepening their collaboration. SEA-EU was awarded with a Project again, now incorporating three new partners.





SEA-EU 2.0: Specific Objectives



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- 1. Plan the governance of the Alliance towards a higher level of integration
- 2. Promote a diversity of training pathways (from **microcredentials** to **joint degrees**)
- 3. Encourage student and staff mobility (at least 50%)
- 4. Promote inclusiveness (acceptance of diversity, gender equality...)
- 5. Commitement to sustainability (Green Deal and SDG)
- 6. Promote the use of **English** and **multilingualism**
- 7. Accelerate digital transformation
- 8. Strengthen the **link with society** (open educational resources, open science, open data...)
- 9. Strenghtening the link with **stakeholders** through a co.creation mechanism
- 10. Making SEA-EU a role model for other Universities in Europe and internationally
- 11. Leveraging our strengh in the marine and maritime fields
